It also inspired him to contend with the complicated legacy that continues to affect black and white Americans, Africans, and Cubans today. Not only were black people enslaved in the North for over two hundred years, but the vast majority of all slave trading in America was done by northerners. Remarkably, half of all North American voyages involved in the slave trade originated in Rhode Island, and all the northern states benefited.
